MASONIC SPOTLIGHT: OUR GREATEST (MISSED) OPPORTUNITY

As Masons, we play an important role. We have the unique opportunity to introduce Masonic values to today's new generations.

DeMolay International is a Masonic-sponsored organization for young men between the ages of 12 and 21. DeMolay was founded by a Mason in the Kansas City community, in 1919 - after the close of WWI. Locally, Paul Revere Chapter was chartered shortly after, in April of 1921. While Paul Revere Chapter was originally sponsored by the Tampa Scottish Rite (next door), it relocated to Hillsborough Lodge in the mid 1950's.

Young ladies have two similar opportunities. Job's Daughters International was founded in 1920 and the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls in 1922. Both organizations offer moral foundation and social development for young ladies in their formative years (JDI for ages 10 to 20; Rainbow for ages 11 to 21).

Today, all three organizations sponsor pledge groups for younger youth, getting them involved at an even earlier age.

Providing an example worthy of emulation could very well establish an example of Freemasonry that these young people will expect to see in their sponsoring bodies. It is important to remember that our Masonic Youth Groups are not Masonic-affiliated organizations; rather, they are Masonic-sponsored organiza-

tions. There is no requirement for the youth members to join the adult organizations when they reach lawful age. The decision to join the adult organizations will forever be reinforced by the personal interactions they enjoy while active as a youth.

Always be mindful that today's youth are the future leaders of our country, our communities, and – for the purpose of this communication – our Fraternity.

Brothers,

We are off and running for another year. Your support is needed to continue to stay up and running so if you haven't already done so, please pay your dues.

You may have noticed that your dues went up by \$5.00 this year. At our last Grand Lodge

Communication, the craft voted to increase the pro capita tax by \$5.00 per year for the next 5 years. As with most businesses, the cost to continue to operate continues to rise, and the current amount of your dues that goes to Grand Lodge is not enough to run our operation. As changes are made to the computer system and the building gets older (just like Lodge buildings) items need to be repaired or replaced.

So, if you have not paid your dues for 2020, please consider paying them before too much more time passes. The longer you wait, the more likely you are to forget and then you get a notice from the Lodge that you are in arears. This notice costs the Lodge time and money: the time to prepare the notifications and the cost of the paper, envelope, and postage.

We are receiving calls and emails from Brothers who for one reason or another have been suspended for the nonpayment of dues and now want to be reinstated into the Lodge. With Brothers coming back to the Lodge and the interest we are seeing from others in joining the Lodge, hopefully membership will increase.

Circumscribe will soon be the way to pay your dues, show that you are current in your dues, and will allow you to change your contact information when necessary. If you have not logged on the Circumscribe site, you need to do so! See page 6 for log in information or call the Lodge if needed.

Please remember your Masonic home. The \$7.30 that is on your dues notice is voluntary, but remember that this is your home. You may need to use the home's services someday.

Please inform us if you know a Brother who is ill, is having surgery, or who has passed to the Celestial Lodge Above. Please call and give us his name, details on his sickness, or the date if he passed. If you have his address



Circumscribe is the Grand Lodge of Florida's membership database system. We encourage ALL members to log into Circumscribe and verify their contact information. The sytem allows you to edit your contact information as well as view your Masonic record, pay dues online, and take the Master Mason exams online. The Lodge uses the address, email address, and phone number listed within the system to contact you when needed. We often find members without updated contact information and it sometimes leads to suspension for nonpayment of dues.

First Time Circumscribe Log In Instructions

- Open your internet browser
- Navigate to: https://glfl.circumscribe.net
- Enter your initial Username:
 "FL" + "Your Grand Lodge Number" + "@changeyouremail.info"
 (example: FL1234567@changeyouremail.info)
- Enter your temporary Password: "FL" + "Your Grand Lodge #" (example: FL1234567)
- You will be immediately prompted to change both your username and password Your NEW username can be any email address that you frequently use, or have regular
- Your NEW password must contain at least eight characters and one number. You must
- Upon successfully entering both, you will be required to logout, and then log back in with your new credentials.
- Once you have logged back in, select 'Profile' from the menu items on the left side of the screen. Review your profile and make any appropriate changes, or contact the Lodge Secretary if you require other changes.
- Finally, upload a current picture for your new permanent ID card. Please avoid hats, sunglasses, other individuals or animals in the picture.
- Select 'Save Profile' to complete the process.

Please note, if you or the Lodge Secretary have already added your personal email address to the system, you will need to log in using that email address and your known password or use the "forgot password" feature. If you aren't sure which email address you used, or if one is already in the system, email the Lodge Secretary at secretary@hillsborough25.org and he can verify the email address.

Being able to introduce this generation to Masonic Tenets will help build a foundation for a better society in the coming years. Additionally, in interacting with the youth, you will find that many of the adult advisors/volunteers who work with the youth may not yet be Masons. Your interactions can also serve as an opportunity to lead them to Masonic affiliation.

As our youth groups redevelop, if we are doing our job the organizations will grow in popularity and status. It should be stressed that our youth groups teach good morals and that we need to work hard to encourage more young people getting involved. If they need additional quality adult leaders, we need to help them seek out those leaders; we need to be those leaders. If they have a need for youth members, we need to assist them in developing programs to promote their organization and recruit new members, possibly by requesting referrals from our own members. If they are short of funds, we need to network on their behalf, urging local Masonic Groups to consider providing financial support for their benefit.

As sponsors to these Masonic Youth Groups, we need to provide more than a building for them to meet. We have a human interest towards their success. We have a responsibility to provide for them, to protect them, and to perpetuate their success.
